

Monopoly GO Free Dice Links: Free Rolls Work to Find Them

Monopoly GO free dice links are limited-time reward URLs that hand out extra rolls, and sometimes other in-game items, without any purchase required. Players search for them constantly because dice run out fast once you're mid-event, and the wait for rolls to refill naturally can be slow. This page explains how these dice links work, how to tell whether one is worth clicking, and what to do once your current batch of active links runs out, since availability shifts throughout the month and individual links rarely stay valid for long.



Latest Monopoly GO Free Dice Links

Individual dice links are usually only valid for a day or two before Scopely retires them and rotates in new ones, which means a fixed list printed here would likely be out of date within hours of publishing. Rather than risk pointing you toward a dead or already-claimed link, the most reliable move is to check Monopoly GO's official Facebook, X (formerly Twitter), and Instagram accounts directly, along with the in-game rewards inbox, since new links are typically posted there first.

That said, it helps to know what these promotions usually contain so you can recognize a good one when you see it. Recent dice link promotions have generally offered a set number of free rolls — batches of 25 dice rolls have been a common reward size — sometimes bundled with a sticker pack or a themed shield or collectible tied to whatever event is currently running. Reward sizes and bundled extras vary from one promotion to the next, so treat any specific number you see elsewhere as accurate only for that particular link and moment.

What Are Monopoly GO Dice Links?

A Monopoly GO dice link is a promotional URL, generally published by Scopely (the game's developer) through official social channels, that grants a reward when opened on a device with the game installed. Most commonly the reward is a batch of extra dice rolls, but some links distribute other items instead, such as sticker packs, event currency, or limited-time collectibles tied to a current in-game event.

These links exist because Monopoly GO relies heavily on players having enough rolls to keep moving around the board, especially during high-value events and tournaments. Distributing free dice periodically keeps players engaged without requiring them to spend money or simply wait out the game's natural roll-refill timer.

How Monopoly GO Free Dice Links Work

Each dice link is tied to a specific promotional reward and is generally usable once per player account. When you

open the link on a mobile device, it's designed to redirect into the Monopoly GO app itself rather than staying in the browser, triggering an in-game pop-up that confirms what you've received.

Most current guidance suggests that dice links only function properly once your account has unlocked the game's sticker album feature, which has generally required reaching around level 15. Attempting to use a link before reaching that point may result in the link failing to register a reward, even if the link itself is still technically active. Requirements like this can change with game updates, so if a link doesn't work as expected, checking your current level and app version is a reasonable first step.

How to Claim Free Dice Links

Claiming a legitimate dice link is usually straightforward, but a few practical details make the difference between a smooth claim and a frustrating one.

- Open the link directly on the mobile device where Monopoly GO is installed, rather than on a desktop computer, since the reward is generally tied to the app itself.
- Allow the link to redirect into the Monopoly GO app when prompted, rather than staying in the mobile browser.
- Make sure the app is updated to its latest version beforehand, since outdated versions can sometimes fail to register a promotional reward correctly.
- If the link opens in a browser and doesn't redirect automatically, try a different browser app, since some in app or default browsers handle these redirects inconsistently.
- Confirm you're logged into the correct game account before claiming, since the reward is applied to whichever account is active at the time.

Not every link behaves identically on every device, and occasional inconsistencies are common with this type of promotional system, so a little troubleshooting is sometimes necessary even with a fully active link.

Why a Dice Link May Not Work

If a dice link fails to deliver a reward, there are several possible explanations, and it's worth ruling out the simple ones before assuming something is broken.

- The promotion has expired: most dice links are only valid for a day or two, so a link found through an older post or outdated list may simply no longer be live.
- The reward was already claimed: each link is generally limited to one redemption per account, so reopening a link you've already used typically won't grant a second reward.
- The link has been deactivated early: Scopely can pull a promotion before its expected expiration for various reasons.
 - Regional or version restrictions: some promotional links may be limited to certain regions or app versions.
- The app needs updating: an outdated version of Monopoly GO can sometimes fail to process a valid link correctly.

If you've ruled these out and a link still isn't working, it's more likely an issue with that specific promotion than with your account, and checking for a newer link is usually the fastest solution.

Other Ways to Get Free Monopoly GO Rolls

Dice links are only one piece of the reward system. Several other legitimate, ongoing methods can keep your roll count topped up even when no fresh link is currently available.

Daily Login Rewards

Monopoly GO has generally included a daily login bonus system, often described in-game as a daily rewards or "Daily Treats" style feature, that grants dice and other items simply for opening the app regularly.

Friend Invitations

Inviting friends to install and play the game has generally been rewarded with additional dice per successful invite, with some versions of the game offering extra milestone rewards after inviting a certain number of friends. Exact invite limits and bonus thresholds can vary between updates, so checking the current invite screen in-app is the most accurate way to see what's on offer.

Sticker Albums and Duplicate Safes

Completing a sticker album, and in some cases opening safes built from duplicate stickers, has generally provided dice alongside other rewards. This gives players a long-term, non-time-sensitive way to earn extra rolls through regular collecting and trading.

Events, Tournaments, and Milestone Challenges

Limited-time events and tournaments frequently reward active participation with additional dice, and some versions of the game have included milestone-based challenge systems, sometimes unlocked at higher player levels, that hand out smaller, steady batches of dice for completing specific in-game tasks.

Natural Regeneration

Dice rolls also regenerate gradually over time simply by playing the game, with the rate generally tied to your progress. This won't replace the value of a big promotional link, but it means you're never entirely without rolls even between events.

Tips for Getting More Monopoly GO Dice

- Check official Monopoly GO social accounts at consistent times, since new links tend to appear multiple times over the course of a day rather than on a fixed schedule.
- Open the in-game rewards inbox every session, since some bonuses are delivered there automatically without needing an external link.
- Save a portion of your dice ahead of major events rather than spending everything immediately, so you have rolls ready when a high-value event begins.
- Prioritize your daily login and available sticker trades before searching for outside links, since these are reliable, account-based sources rather than time-limited promotions.
- Be selective about which third-party sites you rely on for dice link roundups, since not all of them verify that a link is still active before posting it.

Are Monopoly GO free dice links really free?

Yes. Legitimate dice links don't require any payment — they're promotional rewards distributed by the game's developer, generally through official social media channels or in-app notifications.

How often are new Monopoly GO dice links released?

New links can appear multiple times within a single day, though there's no fixed publishing schedule. Checking official channels regularly is more reliable than expecting links at a set time.

Can I use the same dice link more than once?

Generally no. Most dice links are designed to be redeemed once per account, so reopening a link you've already claimed typically won't add another reward.

Why does a Monopoly GO dice link expire?

Dice links are tied to short promotional windows, usually lasting no more than a day or two, after which the developer retires them and often replaces them with a new promotion.

What should I do if a dice link does not open?

Try opening it directly on the mobile device with Monopoly GO installed, make sure the app is updated, and try a different browser if it isn't redirecting properly. If none of that works, the link itself may already be expired.

Where can I find new Monopoly GO rewards?

Monopoly GO's official Facebook, X (formerly Twitter), and Instagram accounts are generally the most direct sources for new dice links, alongside the game's own in-app rewards and notifications area.

Final Thoughts

Free dice links are a genuinely useful part of playing Monopoly GO without spending money, but they're also the most time-sensitive reward source in the game, which is why no static list can guarantee an active link days or weeks after it's published. The steadier approach is combining whatever links are currently live with the game's built-in reward systems — daily logins, friend invites, sticker album progress, and event participation — so your roll count stays healthy even during the gaps between promotions. Check back regularly, verify links through official Monopoly GO channels, and treat any site asking for account credentials or unusual downloads before showing a "reward" as a sign to look elsewhere.
